A letter of appeal to fellow residents of Harper Lake

Dear Neighbor,

As most of you know, in the summer of 2012, five families in the channel to the west of Harper Island made an investment to assure our boat access to the lake.

Because of limited access to the lake due to low mid-summer water levels in the past, we consulted with the DNR, obtained the required permits, hired a commercial dredger to remove several thousand yards of the marrow bottom and paid for its disposal. At the time we were investigating in this project, we asked the association if the other residents of the lake wanted to contribute and open the access through the entire channel. We were told the majority didn't wish to contribute to this much larger project.

We then down sized the project and the five of us fully funded (over \$45,000) the dredging of a small channel just off our docks for lots 63 to 67. The channel does not go through. It is only a 20ft wide cut from the north part of the lake, south down to lot 67, (McGreger's) and ends there .

While we understand your curiosity, when motors are used near the east edge of the newly created channel, marrow is forced back into the dredged area. We are asking that you respect our significant investment and try to avoid this area with motorized watercraft. With your help, we hope to be able to use this channel for access for several years.

Please stay east of the drop-off just east of the marker buoys and rafts we have placed along this fragile wall.

BUDGET UPDATE

Calendar year 2013 finished strong for Harper Lake Association. A total of 96 members supported the Association this year and allowed the board the needed income to complete a number of important projects.

The annual fish planting came in on budget.

The most successful Poker Run with 360 participants virtually paid for itself.

The upgraded water quality monitoring and weed control program came in under budget.

A lack of gypsy moth infestation for the last several years has also helped provide a surplus in our checking account, but that has begun to shrink with the added weed control contracted for in 2013.

The board is committed to monitoring and maintaining the quality of the lake for fishing, boating, swimming and general recreational use as much as possible and has made every effort to spend your dollars as wisely as possible.

As all of our yearly costs rise, we are preparing to tighten the budget to coincide with our fixed income.

We are asking the members to start giving us feedback on the continuation of both the fish planting and weed control programs. At this point, our fund balance allows us to continue both programs for the 2014 calendar year. However, we will start to have a shortfall if we move forward at the same spending levels. Our options would be to increase revenue or find ways to cut service. Your input is valuable.

Thanks to all those that generously volunteered their time this year and especially to all who have paid their association dues for 2013.
