#### **MILFOIL AND WEED CONTROL:**

PLM, the experts in lake quality maintenance, treated Harper Lake in June for the invasive Mil Foil weed. This weed threatens to choke out many Michigan inland lakes unless treated on a regular basis.

Treatment was canceled last year due to the unusually cold weather and fears arose that we would have a backlash of excessive growth this year.

Normally we treat only 4 to 6 acres of the 80 acre lake, but this year, the growth was less than expected.

In July, a follow up survey was made and only the area around the buoy on the north side of the lake required attention.

Native weeds were also treated in the launch area. This was the second of a two year commitment and will most likely be the last. Questions and suggestions will be taken at the September 5<sup>th</sup> Membership Meeting.

#### **RULE REMINDERS**

"SLOW, NO WAKE" for all motorized water craft shall be between 7:30pm and 11:00am.

Speed boating, waterskiing, and operation of personal watercraft shall be between the hours of 11:00am and 7:30pm.

All watercraft must circle the lake in a counter clockwise direction.

100 FOOT RULE: SLOW-NO WAKE SPEED must be maintained within 100 feet of shoreline, any watercraft, docks, fishermen, rafts, swimming areas, and swimmers

Remember: Excessive noise and bad language can be heard while you are out on the lake. Please respect others while we all enjoy Harper Lake.
